





**19 videos** were generated over the past year including the Healing HeARTS gala. Videos were generally interview style and recorded over Zoom that focused on an array of issues within the foster care system.

# DIVERSITY AND RACIAL EQUITY OUTREACH

Annually, and FY 2020-2021 was no different, CASA SHaW has trained our advocates, staff, and child welfare partners about systemic bias, the impacts of trauma, and the profound, lifelong impacts of poverty and disenfranchisement. We are committed to listening, to learning, and to fighting for equality.

CASA SHaW completed our 8-months long racial equity circles for board, staff, and volunteers with a focus on the African American experience.

Annie Murray of Califon, a CASA volunteer since 2016, said "the racial equity group was of great benefit in giving me insight into my own prejudices and sense of entitlement. I have grappled with the issue of race much of my life and been aware of how racial prejudice can destroy people and communities. But these sessions gave me an opportunity to investigate my own biases. The readings were excellent and the discussions were stimulating. I was especially impacted by the book, Caste by Isabell Wilkerson."

The idea behind the racial equity circles is that if individuals take time to understand one another's experiences in an intimate and respectful way, CASA's volunteers will be better advocates for the foster children served. As a result of racial equity circle's success, CASA SHaW will be holding racial equity circles this coming Fall that will specifically focus on the Asian-American experience within our communities.

# SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Throughout FY 2019-2020 CASA SHaW filled children and family requests for items through the Connie Fund. CASA SHaW provided food, diapers, wipes, toys, and technology during the pandemic. This totaled \$24,575.

Art auction donations were welcomed and a wonderful way to come together during a difficult year. While the pandemic impacted fundraising, the art auction in the spring of 2021 raised \$15,757 while friends of CASA SHaW donated \$12,000+ in artwork.

Child visits were completed regularly. CASA SHaW volunteers and staff maintained contact with schools, parents, therapists, doctors, and other community-based stakeholders.

Whether you are a supporter, a stakeholder, a donor, an advocate, a board member, or a staff member, we all have a role to play in advocating for children in the foster care system. Thank you for all that you do to help us move CASA SHaW's mission forward as we seek to serve every child who needs an advocate. In the words of Mary Mead, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed, citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has." That who we are, and that's what we do.
